### Happy 25th Anniversary CampToons!

ampToons is our 6 weeks summer day camp program for ◆those entering 1st to 8th. It has not always been for 6 weeks. It all started in 1993 by Pastor Jerry Wong (Gonzo) and Cynthia (Ping) Woo (Elmo) as an outreach to the neighborhood children instead of our usual 1 week summer VBS program. Our first year was our trial year to see how it would go. It was for 4 weeks, about 15 staff and about 50 children attended from 1st to 5th grade. As you can tell, it went well and we decided to do 7 weeks the following year. We also added the 6th grade group, our staff increased to 30, and enrollment averaged about 90 per week. We discovered that 7 weeks was too much for our staff and tried 6 weeks the 3rd year and discovered that was just right for our staff. Each year our numbers in campers and staff have increased. We now average 70 staff and over 200 campers each year. The first year was the only year that we passed out flyers around the neighborhood promoting CampToons. After that it was all through word of mouth from parents telling







other parents and campers telling their friends.

Our staff consists of graduating 8th graders, high school students, college students, and post-college people. Many serve for years and some continue to help out after they stop serving (from driving, leading worship, subbing, and providing extra support for big activities.)

Our staff have camp names. The campers don't know our real name and they try to guess our real name throughout camp. We don't have academics as we want them to have fun by taking them out on activities off-site or doing activities on-site. We want the campers to be in a Gospel centered environment as for many this is the first time or only time they are exposed to the church. The rapport the counselors build with the children are genuine and the children see it which makes them want to return. Through this rapport we want to help them understand the Gospel more and to see it through our interaction with them. Our focus has changed over the years. Our priority first started as evangelizing to the children that attended and as our staff grew, the priorities changed. We are now focused on discipling our staff and helping them grow spiritually as they serve and our 2nd focus is evangelizing to the children and families. Last summer the summer Parenting series was started as a way to connect with the parents.

Over these years, families have been introduced to the church, over 300 children have been saved, campers have become gophers, counselors and even directors, and we have had 3 extension sites (Visitacion Valley, Oceanview, and Millbrae.) Only the Millbrae extension continues.

CampToons was never expected to go this long when it first started. We knew it would end sometime but God had other plans for this program. We serve each year as if it's our last year as we never know if this may be the last year.











## Serving Lawton By the Numbers

## City Impact Conference 2017

In July, my husband, Richard and I joined the Sunset Church group of 20 at the City Impact Conference. It was a beautiful day of worship, fellowship, and service for the residents of the Tenderloin neighborhood. The Tenderloin is located near City Hall and is considered one of the worst neighborhoods in the city with a high crime rate, homelessness, and drug activity. Our morning session started with an introduction about the Tenderloin neighborhood and a bit of the history of the City Impact Ministry. This was my 3rd time at the conference, but each time I hear a new piece of the amazing story of God's calling of Pastor Roger Huang to the Tenderloin and our Lord's miraculous provisions. Richard and I worked in the kitchen for meal preparations to give to the volunteers doing the door-to-door food delivery and sit-down meals. There were 45 outreaches to the residents that day includ-

ing serving food, washing feet, hosting building parties, giving fresh haircuts, clothing and medical assessments and so much more. The residents were loved and prayed for. These all were opportunities for starting conversations about the Gospel of Jesus. We ended our day with a message from Pastor Ben Houston of Hillsong about including ourselves in the things of God. Worship was led by Matt Redman! It was a wonderful day!

I really love the opportunity to live out the Gospel by participating (what little I did) in Biblical justice and am encouraged when surrounded by so many other believers doing the same. In the past, the Tenderloin was not a neighborhood I would typically visit, and the residents, I probably would try to avoid eye contact. After serving with this ministry, I see that they are not to be avoided, but each person is truly loved by God and needs to know the love of Jesus too. My takeaway of the day was just a phrase from Christian Huang that went something like this: When we see something and are moved by it, but do no action- that is emotion. When we are moved and do something- that is compassion.

Throughout the various testimonies, messages, and worship sessions during the event, I witnessed how God can impact and transform many lives through just a handful of individuals. On a personal note, I have been truly blessed by serving in the AaB ministry for the past year. I have witnessed God's faithfulness, grace, and guidance through every step of the way, and I have experienced how important it is to have a willing heart to do His work. I am hopeful and confident that God will continue raising up more people to serve in this ministry. – Molinda Hom

The City Impact Conference was a wonderful opportunity to worship God and to serve others. Christian Huang gave us a sobering perspective to consider. We are surrounded by people in need. The response to that situation can be 1) Lord, do something! 2) a teary emotional response of helplessness or 3) it's inconvenient for me to get involved now (I have too much on my plate/I have too many other issues to deal with). A counter to those responses could be 1) the Lord says—You do it (with My strength and guidance), 2) a compassionate response moving me to action (an example is Christ pausing to feed the five thousand in spite of his own demanding schedule), or 3) instead of focusing on inconvenience, visualizing an opportunity to be a blessing to others as I seek to glorify God. The Conference gave much for us to reflect upon and City Impact provides many opportunities for us to serve. – **Gary Gin** 

### Let's Worship Together "By Bringing God Our Finest" - Article 3

When you gather two couches full of Worship Pastors, what do you think they'll talk about? Worship of course! But these Worship Pastors at the Worship Together 2017 Conference didn't simply talk about music and what are the best keys to choose for congregational singing or how to light the stage to give people the concert experience. There were three truths that really struck me from the Worship Pastor Panel: 1) Everyone leads worship 2) We want to bring our finest to God 3) Pastor the person, then pastor the gift. I believe these truths can crossover to every person in the congregation and not just those considered on the Worship Team.

Everyone leads worship. This is the idea that everyone has a role they play in terms of leading worship and that each role is just as important as the next. We commonly think of the "worship team" as being only the musicians/singers but the panel



wanted to stress that everyone including the person who does the projector slides help to lead worship; without the lyrics on the screen, the congregation would likely not be able to sing along. We are equally carrying the yoke of worship. We should fulfill our roles with the mindset that we are to be one team with one vision and one heart – all seeking to worship God. It made me think of how we're ALL called to worship God; not just the team on stage but everyone in the congregation too. It's just as important for us to be present in the room as it is for the music team to be present. We need to be present, not just physically but mentally and spiritually also! Which brings me to the next point...

We want to bring our finest to God. What does your finest look like? For musicians, it can mean practicing! One of the ways I see "practicing" for worship is that we refine our craft so that when it comes time to join in congregational worship, we can worship God alongside each other rather than worrying about hitting the right note or other technical issues – the focus is on the worship not the music. For all of us, bringing our finest is figuring out how we can bring our best worship to God. How am I preparing for congregational worship? Sleeping early? Praying? Have I been continuing to work on my relationship with God so I can worship Him in spirit and truth? In order for us to worship in spirit and truth (John 4:23–24), we must know who we are worshipping and why.

Pastor the person, then pastor the gift. I believe this is one of the most important reminders that I came away with from the panel. It is of the utmost importance for us to keep our times of worship Christ-centered and so we must place the priority not on merely developing our gifts, but on our relationships with God – the Giver of these gifts. As a worship leader, I endeavored to know how my fellow team members were walking with God and how we can walk together since we were leading worship together. We would spend time in the word, sharing about our relationships with God, sharing what God was doing in other areas we were serving through.

My prayer for all of us is that we would endeavor to bring our finest to God; that we would worship in spirit and truth. I pray that we would strive to know the walks of those worshipping alongside us by talking and meeting together and pointing each other to the Cross. Amen.

### Cambodia Short-Term Missions Trip Reflections



raise God for an amazing Short-Term Missions trip in Cambodia! Our 11-day missions trip was a fruitful and life-changing experience for our 16-member team. We learned more about yourselves and our loving God as we worked together in unity to demonstrate God's love and compassion to the poor, hurt and lost in Phnom Penh.

We went to Cambodia with a mission to share God's love and hope but we didn't expect to be blessed abundantly as we received so much love and encouragement in return from everyone we had the privileged to meet there from the young children to the faithful missionaries.

Thank you to our Sunset Church family and our supporters who prayed and supported us financially to make this trip possible. Sharing the gospel and caring for the people in Cambodia allowed us to see the Holy Spirit at work in amazing ways that we don't often get to see here at home.

We came home with a full and grateful heart, a clearer perspective of God's mission and a renewed appreciation of being able to participate in God's plan to share the gospel to all nations.

Below are some of the highlights that our Cambodia team was privileged to experience:

- Experiencing the joy of working together as a body of Christ to serve the children and seeing how each person rose up to use their God-given talents to serve God in Cambodia.
- Being greeted respectfully and lovingly with a "Good morning teacher!" each morning by kids eager to see us; some kids would arrive at 6am even though the program started at 9am!
- Sharing the gospel to hundreds of children and adults through vacation bible school, village walks, and other interactions.
- Witnessing the Holy Spirit at work to open hundreds of hearts to receive Jesus; the harvest is ripe in Cambodia, but who will go to reap what has been sown by those who have gone before us?
- Sharing practical parenting tips with local parents and reminding them that grace and love is from God and that's how our homes should be.
- Teaching English phrases to eager-to-learn elementary students and teaching computer skills to teachers and school staff.



- Encouraging the missionaries who are already overseas to continue faithfully in the work that God has put before them by listening to their stories of God's providence, sovereignty, and by praying with and for them.
- Encouraging the local pastors to continue making disciples in their communities.
- Praying with families in local villages such as a village built on what is known as "the garbage river."
- Bringing a smile to a young lady in the Pleroma Home (who is recovering from sex trafficking) and seeing the delight in her eyes after making a bag out of a t-shirt.



- Seeing the delight in the teachers' eyes as they savor fresh ripe durian! They love durian over there! When we asked the kids, "who loves durian?", almost all 100+ students raised their hands!
- Seeing the proud smiles on the children wearing their new "Jesus loves you" T-shirts; many wear torn, tattered, and oversized clothes.
- Witnessing a surprised joyful look from a barefooted child when he received a new pair of shoes that we bought to show how God provides for us so we can provide for others.
- Seeing a mother's eyes light up in pride and happiness when her daughter showed the frame she decorated and her picture inside as a reminder that Jesus loves her.
- Being inspired by the faithful missionaries who left their homes and families to serve the people of Cambodia.
- Getting the opportunity to meet with IJM Cambodia staff to learn about their mission to fight for justice on behalf of the poor and defenseless.
- Gaining a bigger vision of God's mission and growing a heart like Jesus full of compassion for the poor and lost across the world.

- 許多人普遍穿著破舊和不襯身的的衣服. 當換上我們所帶來新的"耶穌愛你"的T恤後,可以看到他們充 滿著感恩的的笑容:。
- •當一個赤腳的孩子收到一雙我們新買給他的鞋子,從他臉上看到一個驚喜的表情,神如何賜福給我們, 我們也可以轉送給別人。
- 當母親看到她女兒將她裝飾好的相框和她的照片時,她的眼睛流露出自豪和歡樂,提醒耶穌愛她。
- 受到幾位離開家園和家屬,為柬埔寨人民服務的忠實傳教士的啟發。
- 有機會與柬埔寨"正義使命團 IJM"工作人員會晤,了解他們代表窮人和手無寸鐵的弱勢群體爭取正義 的使命。
- •看到聖靈的工作,打開百多個人的心來接受耶穌;柬埔寨的莊稼已經熟了,但是誰去收割那些在我們 前面已經散了種子而要收的莊稼呢?

It's a blessing to be a blessing, because as a blessing, one also gets blessed. This is what I have come to learn. It may not be materials, it may not be "things" one gets blessed with. But one does gets blessed with life, and more life. Maybe that's what Jesus meant when He said that through Him we would have life, and life abundant (Jn 10:10). When we become a part of the fulfillment of the great commission, we get to participate in what God is doing, and send opposition to what satan is doing. Because we know that the enemy's purpose is to steal, kill, and destroy, but Jesus came that we may have life, and life to the full (Jn 10:10). With that being said, I think God poured me out, and filled me up at the same time. How do I describe the student's smiles in words, or their joyful screams and shouts whenever the team entered the school? How do I put into words their

hugs, or their high fives as they cherish the human contact. Or the fact that even though they grow up with little to almost nothing, they live as though they have everything. Seeing this, and learning from them, they have taught me to be grateful, and to cherish what, and who I have, not look at what I don't. That love does not have to be communicated with words, but through commitment, loyalty, trust, respect, and an openness that can only happen from being present to children.

As I reflect on this trip, I am amazed that the Holy Spirit truly was moving among our team. It's a testimony to the Holy Spirit's work in and among us that there was no division. Sure, some people clung closer to one another, but overall, we all mingled amongst ourselves, and no one (I believe) felt left out. That out of God's provision, and His sovereign grace, He handpicked each member to be a part of this life changing mission trip; Even as we are over a month back from our trip, we all still keep in contact, our message thread still buzzes almost everyday and it is nothing short of miraculous.

Lastly, the big one is faithfulness. This is personal to me as I was seeking a word or more from our Lord. I'd like to believe that He was singing over me "be faithful." God through His word does not command us to be fruitful servants, and that should be a good thing, a sigh of relief. But rather, God through Jesus commands us to be faithful servants with what He has given us. Whether it's little, or much, Jesus (just) commands us to be faithful, and as long as we are faithful, (through His grace), Jesus will provide the fruit. What a sigh of relief, maybe. We met a lot of missionaries; some who should be retired and not in cambodia, others, just graduated college, and yet, the theme I came to find was that they were all faithful in following God's call over their life, even if they didn't know what that exactly looked like. They just knew that God was calling them to Cambodia to work with the students, and rescued sex traffic victims, and they have their boots on. They surely don't know what tomorrow, or next month holds, and that's great, because God doesn't give us the whole map, but gives us enough to walk for the day He has graciously given, but more importantly, to trust in Him. It's like what Tolkien said, "Not all who wander, are lost".

I take heart in that quote, because I am learning that even though I don't know what's going to happen a year from now, I have a supernatural confidence and peace, when I say I don't know, but I trust in the One who does hold my future. All I do need to know is that God has called me to be faithful where He has placed me, for the good of others, and to glorify the name of Jesus. To be present in the here and now, not there and later. Take heart, you who wander, for not all who wander, are lost. Be faithful, as the One who is faithful will carry us to completion, and promises to always be with us, to the end of the ages. - Greg Gee

■e arrived at the Pleroma Home for Girls and were briefed on the background of the home and the girls. This wasn't just a regular home; it's a sanctuary for girls who are rescued and recovering from sex trafficking and other horrible forms of abuse. These girls are not only recovering physically and mentally, but more importantly, the Pleroma Home for Girls is helping them recover spiritually by sharing with them the love of Jesus Christ and the Gospel message. As we ascended the stairs into the living room, a flood of girls appeared and I fought back a flood of tears realizing that these young girls didn't look any different from my cousins and nieces. They were just kids, but that had already experienced horrific unfathomable things.

One girl in particular caught my attention during an activity as she suddenly stood up, stooped her head, and walked out. After a little while, she re-entered the living room and walked into her room. I watched as she stood there in the darkness staring blankly at the wall. Suddenly, she looked up and we made eye contact and I smiled warmly at her. Not wanting to interrupt her, I moved my attention back to the activities happening around me. Soon after, she came out of the room and stood next to me elbow-to-elbow. I didn't say a word because I had the feeling that she just needed to stand there and so there we stood in silence watching everything around us.

After about five minutes, she took a step forward and turned towards me. She looked at my shirt and pointed at the Cross in the middle and I said "yes, that's the Cross" and I wondered what was going through her mind but I didn't have to wonder long as she held her arms out and began to motion being bound to the cross. "YES," I exclaimed, "YES! Jesus died on the cross. Jesus died on the cross for YOU." Keep in mind that she didn't really speak English and I certainly do not know how to speak Khmer. She then pointed at the Khmer script on my shirt and I said "YES! Jesus loves you! It says Jesus loves you." She then pointed at my toes and made a painting motion and I sheepishly said "Yeah, my nails are painted. Purple is my favorite color." She then cupped her hands around her mouth and leaned over and whispered things to me. She'd look at me for a reaction and then laugh and so I would laugh. I know I will never know what she said that day but I know that I will never forget our conversation.

At a later time, I spoke with local missionaries who told me they were impressed by my experience. They opened my eyes to the story of that girl: About two years ago, she was found by a Christian couple deep in the forest alone (likely left for dead). She had been obviously abused and was completely vacant; she wasn't able to recognize that there were people around her and didn't talk or eat. They believe she might have been abandoned or sold by her parents to the workers in the forest and those workers likely gave her food if she would do them "favors." The missionaries told me that it was amazing that the girl opened up to me so quickly because it took a long while for her to open up to anyone even at the Home. They said it was "interesting" and that "there's something about [me] that they can't explain. A sort of peace about [me] and God is doing big things with [me]." To hear this encouraged me and to be honest, I'm still processing everything that happened overseas.

We want to encourage you to take time to talk to members of our Cambodia STM Team and hear what God did in Cambodia while we were there and what He had already been doing way before we even arrived. God has been doing big things overseas especially in Cambodia and we encourage you to be a part of God's plan to expand His kingdom not only in Cambodia but elsewhere overseas and even here in the States. To find out more on how God can use your gifts, talents, and resources to obey God's command to "go and make disciples of all nations" we encourage you to talk to someone in leadership at Sunset Church so they can get you connected. We encourage you to not only ask Cambodia STM members but also each other 1) What is God doing "over there" (overseas, school, work, with your family, etc) 2) How is God and the Gospel impacting you 3) What now? (What are you going to do now with all of this?)

Together we can reach the loss, provide for those in need, share the Gospel message and God's love.

## Sunset Profile: Eddie Hong

#### O: Tell us a little about yourself, your family, your background and your spiritual journey.

We are also blessed with our miracle son, Samuel, after 15 years of prayers. He is now 22 years old, working in New York.

I received Jesus Christ as my personal Savior around 10 years old during summer retreat in Hong Kong, baptized at Missionary Alliance Church in 1969, met Wan-Wan at Basic Youth Conflict seminar in 4/76, married on 12/25/76, and lived a roller coaster spiritual journey until I joined BSF, which helped regulate my spiritual growth 11 years ago.

#### Q: What are your hobbies or interests?

I love Bible study, writing, Gospel music, and helping others in spiritual and financial matters. I also enjoy cruises, movies, swimming and table tennis, although I haven't played in decades.

#### Q: If you can go anywhere and do anything, where would you go and do?

Cruise around the world, while leading or sharing Bible study on the cruise—Cruise evangelism and discipleship.

Q: What ministries are you involved in? Why are you passionate about it? How can others get involved? Sunset Men's Ministry, Parents Place Cell Group, and Bible Study Fellowship, BSF. Knowing God and making Him known is my passion. God's Word is living, active and relevant to my daily life, and I depend on His Word for my spiritual survival. Also served in helping others in financial matters as my work ministry.

#### Q: How do you see God working in your life?

**Bad news** is that I was doomed as a sinner (Romans 6:23a), and I still have a sinful nature, and have disgraced God, hurt others and myself.

His compassion aims at us, His sacrifice was made because of us, His punishment disappeared behind us, His knowledge is beyond us, His Way dwells into us, His Spirit rests upon us, His presence is with us, His anger dissipated from us, His power displays through us, His wisdom reveals inside us. His beauty displayed before us, His grace bestows on us, His blessings multiplies upon us, His glory worshipped by us, His greatness is proclaimed by us, His joy and peace sustain within us, and Nothing can separate His love between us.

### O: What is something that people would be surprised to know about you?

Physically, I have hearing loss in both ears since childhood due to firecrackers, so often I may not be able to hear you.

Spiritually, I am much worse a sinner than others think I am. I cannot accept myself for who I was and who I am. By God's mercy and love, He accepted me as I was and as I am. Who am I not to accept myself when God accepted me, and forgave my sins and shame? Thank God for His grace and pity on such a wretch as I was. I can only give thanks, praises, honor and glory to Him who is worthy and deserving.

#### Q: What Bible verse has been the most impactful to you in your Christian Journey? Why?

2 Corinthians 5:17-21: "17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! 18 All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: 19 that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. 20 We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. 21 God made him who had no sin to be sin[b] for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

God gave me new hope to live for Him, and He is faithful to deliver me to Himself until that final day when I will meet Jesus face to face, and ask Him "Why do you make such as wretch as me your treasure?" Amen!
